Keck Park

614 S. Carlisle St

Pavilion & playground. Baseball/softball field, football/soccer field, basketball court, 2 handball courts.

Lehigh Parkway

Located off Lehigh Parkway E, Martin Luther King Jr. Dr., Lehigh Parkway S, Park Dr., & S. Jefferson St. Over 6 miles of trails, bridal path, disc golf course. Home to: Fish Hatchery, Museum of Indian Culture, Fly Shop, Police Academy, Lehigh Valley Road Runners Club House, & Bogert's Bridge.

Old Fairgrounds Playground

On 5th, between Liberty & Gordon Spray Park & Playground areas.

Percy Ruhe (Alton) Park

1519 Oxford Dr

Pavilion & playground. 4 baseball/softball fields, 3 football/soccer fields, 3 basketball courts, 2 racquetball/handball courts.

Roosevelt Park

271 Camp St

Playground, softball/baseball field, 2 basketball courts, 4 tennis courts.

South Mountain Reservoir

2900 S. 10th St

Pavilion, walking trails, wooded area.

Stevens Park

Tilghman & 6th sts.

This park has a community stage with grassy area, playground, ½ basketball court, & pavilion.

Trexler Memorial Park

195 Springhouse Rd

Walking and bicycle trails, grassy areas. Upper loop has a sculpture of General Trexler on his horse. Trexler Park is a "passive park," which means no events are held there.

Trout Creek Park

East – S. 5th St, from Public Rd. to Auburn St West – Along Mack Blvd until Juniata St 2 baseball/ softball fields, 1 basketball court, 1 volleyball court, playground & picnicing areas.

Union Terrace

200 S. St. Elmo St

Scenic amphitheater & pond. Also has a picnic grove & football/soccer field on the other side of the park.

Valania Park

Union & 6th sts

Playground, picnic tables, & basketball court.

Walking Purchase Park


Entrance on Constitution Ave. when turning N. from Susquehanna Blvd.


Trails and greenery.

18 Hole Championship Public Golf Course. Includes year round lighted driving range, short game area, & putting greens. Clubhouse with golf shop, Jack's Slice Restaurant & Bar. Open year-round. Pavilion that seats 150 for outings & events.

Andre Reed (Irving) Park

Playground, pool & bathhouse, 2 baseball/ softball fields, 1 football/soccer field, 2 basketball courts, 4 tennis courts.

Arts Park

24-32 N. 5th St

Where the Arts Walk begins, a great place to eat lunch & listen to musical performances.

Bucky Boyle Park

10 Pump Pl

Playground, spray park, pavilion. 2 baseball/softball fields, 1 football/soccer field, 2 basketball courts.

Canal Park

S. Albert St. – near Keck Park

Pavilion, trails, Bike & Boat with Wildlands Conservancy.

Cedar Park

Cedar Beach – 101 N Ott St

4 lighted basketball courts, 2 beach & 2 hard volleyball courts, 1,900 sq. ft. Destination Playground, newly renovated Cedar Pool & a pavilion.

Cedar Creek Parkway-

East of Ott St. & Parkway Blvd

3 pavilions, 1 volleyball court, LifeTrail Wellness Stations.
